### III. Narrative Description of Conference

The Cincinnati Project hosts an annual symposium with two goals: 1) showcase the community-partnered research that has been conducted in the last year, and 2) discuss issues that confront community-partnered researchers. The last two years of the symposium have attracted well over 100 people from the college, university, and broader community.

The 2020 conference theme will be “Living in the City”: Housing Affordability in Cincinnati.” The issue of housing affordability and availability have thrust Cincinnati in the national spotlight. In addition to having eviction rates that are double the national average citizens within Hamilton County are grappling with issues around housing availability and affordability. The expansion of Children’s Hospital in the Avondale neighborhood as well as the building of the FC soccer stadium in the West End neighborhood has raised concerns and awareness that both community members and researchers must contend with if we are to find equitable solutions to the city’s housing crisis. The day long symposium on March 6, 2020 will bring together students, researchers, community members and the university community to discuss viable ways to study the housing crisis. Throughout the day we will also hear from community members and researchers who will propose possible solutions.
